Various activities included a delicious breakfast service, family pictures with Santa (with some proceeds of the sales going to ShareLife), canned food donations, interactive arts and crafts, face painting, a book fair, travelling Christmas entertainers, and our choir known as the Jammin Jayhawks serenading the audience with Christmas songs. This amazing day would not have been possible without the dedication and hard work of our St. John XXIII Catholic School Council, student alumni and staff volunteers.

A Victorian Christmas for John Cabot's ELL Newcomer Program

On December 5, newcomer English Language Learners from John Cabot Catholic Secondary School and their teachers travelled back in time to the 1800s to experience a Victorian Christmas at Black Creek Village. With a growing ELL newcomer population of over 200 students who arrived in Canada within the past few years, Cabot is blessed with students who have travelled thousands of miles from their homes around the world to be with us. Our students come from: Philippines, China, Vietnam, Colombia, Cuba, Ecuador, Mexico, Somalia, Ethiopia, Eritrea, India, Pakistan, Syria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Iraq, Kuwait, Palestine, Turkey, Ukraine, Poland, Georgia and more.

Many of the students that visited Black Creek that day experienced snow for this first time as they walked the grounds where pioneers founded a small village over 100 years ago. Pioneer guides led the students around the village, explaining the lives of farmers, doctors and landowners. Students saw the workings of a printing press and a tinsmith shop. They also sat in a one-room schoolhouse as they learned how children learned the "3 Rs" when they were free from chores on the farms.

Christmas activities included creating home-made ornaments, orange clove pomanders and even singing Christmas songs on the bus on the way back to school.

Students learned many things at Black Creek, but one of the most important lessons they learned is that even though we may speak different languages, festivities, food, fun, family and friends are values we all share no matter where we come from.





On November 24, former students of St. John Bosco Catholic Elementary School, along with Parent Council, volunteered their time to run a Christmas Community Event in the school gym. Families were able to pre-purchase a pizza dinner and have a photo taken with Santa. Children also had the chance to participate in crafts, games and activities, including writing a letter to Santa.

January - Tamil Heritage Month (National)

January 1 – The Solemnity of Mary, The Holy Mother of God (Holy Day of Obligation)

This day dedicated to Mary, Mother of God. It celebrates Mary's role in the Incarnation and in redemption. Her special relationship with her son is emphasized and she is acknowledged as a model of the Church.

January 1 – World Day of Peace

The World Day of Peace was established by Pope Paul VI in 1968 who asked that *"every year, this commemoration be repeated as a hope and promise at the beginning of the calendar which measures and outlines the path of human life in time, that Peace with its just and beneficent equilibrium may dominate the development of events to come."* Each year has a specific theme, chosen by the Holy Father.

January 3 – Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus

"At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, heaven and on earth and under the earth, every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)

January 5 – Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

"On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother." (Matthew 2:11) The feast of the Epiphany is the time during the Christmas season when we celebrate the Magi's visit to the baby Jesus. Along with the three wise men, we mark this special day with joy, for God has seen fit to come to us in the form of a human being, Jesus of Nazareth.

January 5 – First Sunday in Ordinary Time

January 7 – Feast of the Nativity

Tonight the Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Churches who follow the Julian calendar begin the celebration of Christmas.

January 12 – The Baptism of the Lord
